LivingADK Director's Report

Annual Meeting

October 16, 2024

Introduction:

Welcome to our 2024 Annual Membership Meeting!

Accomplishments: It has been a year of transitions!

- In mid-April, Dan Kiefer-Bach, our Director of Community Engagement, was offered a wonderful position as Executive Director for a funding organization called the Cloudsplitter Foundation, based in the tri-lakes area of the Adirondacks but desiring to cover the entire park. While this was a fantastic opportunity for Dan to work remotely and remain in Eagle Bay, it left a gap in LivingADK. Thankfully, we identified two individuals in our region, Steve Underhill and Melissa Pieber, who were able to take over our housing, small business support and food security initiatives which includes management of the Old Forge Farmers Market.

Health Care & Social Service Resource Gaps

- Created over 5 ½ years ago, our working healthcare committee continues to meet monthly to reduce gaps in achievable health and social service-related programs, services and funding and is working with other **local and county** agencies and organizations, **including the Mohawk Valley Health System.**

Projects Completed, in Progress or Making Progress:

- Through continued collaboration with **MVHS and Old Forge Volunteer Ambulance Corps**, our working group received fantastic news earlier this year that we were invited to participate in a MIH Pilot Program being overseen by Home Care Association of NYS. We feel encouraged that a visiting nurse service component is to be included in this pilot. We anticipate this program to be launched in January. Public education around how this program will benefit the community will be forthcoming.
- Continue to promote and help coordinate and advertise another year of local mobile mammography service by Upstate University Hospital.
- **Lunch for Seniors** – a new collaboration in the works with the Old Forge Library and numerous other community organizations to raise funds and coordinate weekly delivered lunches to community seniors starting in January. A recent successful grant award by the Community Foundation to LivingADK is kicking off this program with a \$20,000. We have submitted other grant applications and we are awaiting news. This program is important as our expanded community does not receive a county sponsored meals on wheels or have access to a congregate meal site.

- Continue to support and help facilitate local community engagement events:
 1. Alzheimer's Association – we co-hosted a 3rd annual fundraising walk for caregiver support at Fern Park/Inlet this past June which raised over \$1,800
 2. Promoted a Free ALZ social engagement event at View in July for families dealing with dementia
 3. Co-hosted eight (8) Bagels, Blood Pressure & More Events with the Old Forge Library and OFVAC, with guest resources like HC Public Health, MVHS, RCIL, the Neighborhood Center, MVCAA, insurance navigators, Medicare benefit education, and Alzheimer's Association, to name a few.

Town of Inlet Emergency Communications Tower Project

- LivingADK continues to provide administrative services to the Emergency Communications Tower Group of Inlet by managing donated funds totaling \$238,678. Two towers are erected, power and fiber installed, AT&T service active, T-Mobile service nearing completion, and concrete slab being poured for the emergency comm. equipment building which is waiting to be installed on the site. The Town of Inlet recently requested partial reimbursement of Tower construction costs totaling \$157,451. The Town's annual line item in their budget has been paying for engineering and legal fees.

Food Security & Farmers Market

- Old Forge Farmers Market (now 17 yrs old) –
 - Retirement of Sue Huber as market manager after 7 years
 - Training of new Market Manager, Melissa Pieber
 - A component of our market that has grown over the years is our Direct Nutrition Assistance Program helping to bring fresh market produce to roughly 37 households (\$6,786)
 - Admin assistance to our partner, AdkAction for their \$7,000+ grant to ensure over 20 families/individuals received a CSA bag of agriculture goodness from Exeter Park Produce & Garlic at our market. We intend to work on additional funding to ensure this benefit is available annually.

Community Events

- **Community Shredding Event** – Held in May the last 2 years. The Town gives us permission to use the North Street pavilion parking lot and Herkimer/Oneida Solid Waste Authority provides the shredding truck. Free event. 2023 – 28 cars, 8 totes, 2024 – 48 cars, 14 totes.
- Hosting the Meet the Candidate Nights for Webb and Inlet as needed.

CAP-PY Duck Derby Fundraiser

- Our 14th Annual CAP-PY Duck Derby fundraiser, held Sept. 1st was again a “ducky” success due to amazing volunteers on race day and all summer long. This year’s event was in memory of long-time volunteer NYS Trooper Bob Burney. This event covers about 6% of our annual budget. A big shout out to our Inlet and Old Forge business owners who again donated 19 awesome prizes. Net proceeds totaled just over \$13,051.00. 3,540 ducks raced and all but one (1) duck has been accounted for. Either someone kidnapped #1041 for their jeep or child or it chose to live in the wild.

Homes & Community Renewal/Rural Preservation Program

- At the beginning of 2024, we applied for a State grant through the Neighborhood and Rural Preservation Program (NPP and RPP) which provides administrative funds to support community-based not-for-profit corporations. While many RPP’s are focused on providing services to provide safe, healthy, and affordable housing for families throughout New York State, HCR acknowledges other non-profits who provide a variety of other community-based support initiatives and housing solutions. We were accepted into the program. We recently submitted a half-year follow-up report and applied for their next fiscal plan year July 2024 – June 2025. We hope to hear positive news within the next 30 days.

Restricted Fund Projects

- **Maintain the Chain** – LivingADK continues to be the conduit for MTC whereby our website accepts donations on their behalf supporting efforts to bring healthy lake stewardship to the Fulton Chain of Lakes and surrounding woods, waterways and roadways.

LivingADK actively assists local non-profits and other organizations in identifying and submitting grant applications for various needs. We do not currently charge for this service but instead encourage active membership within LivingADK which supports our operational budget. 2024 Annual Report – Director of Economic Development

i. Grants:

Since I came on board in May of this year, I was the primary writer, with support from Robin, of a \$13,000 grant application to The Cloudsplitter Foundation. This application is for additional funding for our joint project STR-LTR Incubator Program with AdkAction and Adirondack Roots discussed more fully below. We anticipate a decision from Cloudsplitter by the end of October. I also provided support to Robin as she developed the grant application for HCR's Mobile Home Replacement Program.

ii. Programs: *Ongoing LivingADK programs that we develop and/or expand*

Center for Businesses in Transition (CBIT) Six business are now enrolled in the program at various levels. Program assistance is being provided by local volunteer, Steve Schanley. I have been participating in monthly CBIT trainings through Program Developer Adirondack Association of the North Country (ANCA) and will begin to market the program shortly via personal contacts, press releases, social media, and in-person or Zoom presentation as warranted.

- With the InDeed Housing Legacy program, upon joining LivingADK I reviewed, commented on, and suggested changes to make the legal program documents more beneficial to LivingADK. Those documents were delivered to Community Bank for local bank program input in July. Unfortunately, the second-round review is delayed because the bank's legal department is focused on a significant merger. The bank suggests that they may be able to finish their review by year-end, but I anticipate the first quarter of 2025. The bank informs us that, when approved, the documents can be used anywhere in their overall service area, not just LivingADK's area. Recently, two new potential clients have reached out to us. One is not bank-financed so that they can close quickly if the prospect decides to apply and is approved by the program committee. The other may be more of a challenge because the owner/occupant placed the home into an irrevocable trust for their children. We are awaiting the trust documents and will have to decide if the potential risk of working with a number of beneficiaries meets the program's goal.
- STR-LTR Incubator Program (LivingADK/AdkAction/Adirondack Roots). Program development began early in 2024 and program partner AdkAction received a \$20,000 grant from Adirondack Foundation in March 2024. Additionally, AdkAction received a donation of \$10,000 for landlord incentives and LivingADK applied for a \$13,000 grant from The Cloudsplitter Foundation. Since then, the group has completed a toolkit to educate short-term rental landlords about the potential benefits of converting to long-term leases and provide them with tools to make decisions about converting. I developed a calculator to compare short-term abnb businesses to long-term rentals. We are awaiting final copies of the toolkit and a press release from the designer. Interested homeowners or investors will be invited to a Zoom presentation that will provide details of the program. Those who cannot zoom can set up a phone consult or in-person meeting.

iii. Events: *Events I have been the lead on, or have been an integral part in planning and hosting*

- I was approached by Point Positive and the Shipley Center for Innovation at Clarkson University to assist developing a marketing seminar for businesses in the Inlet/Old Forge areas. The target market is Main Street, mom and pop business. These organizations jointly offer seminars every year throughout the Adirondack Park. Point Positive fosters entrepreneurial businesses in the Greater Adirondack Region by providing angel funding and mentoring and education to potential entrepreneurs. We anticipate the seminar to be held in mid-November. We have connected the group with two potential very experienced local marketers to be speakers. Once the date is set, we may assist with site selection, catering, and marketing.

Annual Meeting report from Melissa Pieber for Annual Meeting October 16, 2024

Melissa was sorry to miss this meeting but is on vacation. She and her husband Ryan, the YMCA Camp Gorham Camp Ranger, live in Big Moose.

- Melissa was hired as Farmer's Market Manager/Food Security Program Coordinator after seeing the job opening on WorkforceADK.com earlier this year. Before this position, she worked at Bank of NY Mellon for over 10 years and was looking for something more community based.
- As a way of jumping into food security and what it means, she's been participating in lots of webinars.
- Food education is lacking throughout much of the country. Especially our youth. She'd like to work with the TOW school and ask to speak to the children about healthy eating habits and get them excited for the Farmer's Market and making it a family event.
- This summer, she attended an Adirondack Foundation "Social Safety Network" workshop with Robin in Indian Lake meant to identify actions needed to strengthen our regional social safety network.
- As a steering committee member, she attends monthly meetings for the Adirondack Food Systems Network to keep abreast of any information needed/events to participate in and is helping to plan the annual Food Justice Summit in February. A recent meeting with other food security organizations was recently held in Elizabethtown to discuss available grants supporting our mission.
- Started Farmer's Market Management online classes offered through the Farmers Market Federation. In addition, it connects her with more resources that could potentially be of use in our area.
- This winter she has a goal to collect information from the Farmer's and Artisans from the market to showcase how to obtain their food/goods during the off season (social media, LivingADK's website Community Resource page, etc.)
- She'll be conducting quarterly meetings with the food pantry coalition to identify any gaps in resources (Forestport/Webb/Inlet).
- She relayed her appreciation of Sue Huber's efforts to teach her the in's and out's of managing a Farmers Market.
